Manage Your Finances

Making big commissions from day one is not the reality for the majority of agents. Therefore, it is essential to have savings prior to starting a real estate career. A good rule of thumb is to have at **least six months** of savings to tide you over. This may be a challenging time for new agents, which is why we would recommend managing your expenses to roll over smoothly.

Avoid the temptation to spend your commission check in one swoop and keep to a budget to start efficiently calculating your expenditure.

Understand How Your Agency Operates



To organise your workflow efficiently and take advantage of all opportunities, understanding how your agency operates before joining is strongly advised. This means identifying your task allocation, supervision and coordination that can lead to achieving your goals.

- What geographic areas do I want to serve?
 Who is my target market?
 What resources do I get from my company?
 Which lead generation opportunities will I utilize to the maximum?
 What type of training will I be provided?
- Is the company providing transaction supervision or conveyancing?

What is my accountability structure?

- What is my commission split?
- What is my personal monthly target?
- What is the average sale value in my target market?
- How many deals do I need to close to achieve my monthly target?
- How many listings do I need each week?
- How many leads should I generate per listing?

Build Your Contacts

Real estate is a people's profession. It is a numbers game and you have to build contacts to move forward.

Your Sphere Of Influence

- Your 'sphere of influence' are the people in your personal and professional network with whom your opinion holds some weight. This includes your friends, family, colleagues and acquaintances.
- Ensure you collect the names, email addresses and phone numbers of the people in your sphere.

A good exercise is to notify your contacts that you have started a career in real estate.

"Hi, I have just started in real estate! Who do you know who might be looking to buy, sell or rent?"



Getting Organised with a CRM

- Manage your contacts efficiently using a CRM, or Customer Relationship Management Software.
- A good CRM can help you organise your contacts and tasks. For example, Brokerpad, the UAE's best CRM lets you accessyour contacts and tasks in one dashboard.
- Using a CRM with a user-friendly interface makes all the difference. Every time you get in touch with a potential customer or lead, add their contact details to your CRM.



Find A Mentor

- A mentor in the real estate industry can help you identify opportunities and share advice on enhancing your career. Find an experienced mentor that can guide you for the first few months.
- Ask about their journey, what has enabled them to reach their current position. This also means taking note of the mistakes they have made.



- Consider 'shadowing', a practice where you tag along with your mentor to see how they get on with their work.
- Remember, they are not going to hold your hand throughout your career - it is your initiative that propels your journey forward.

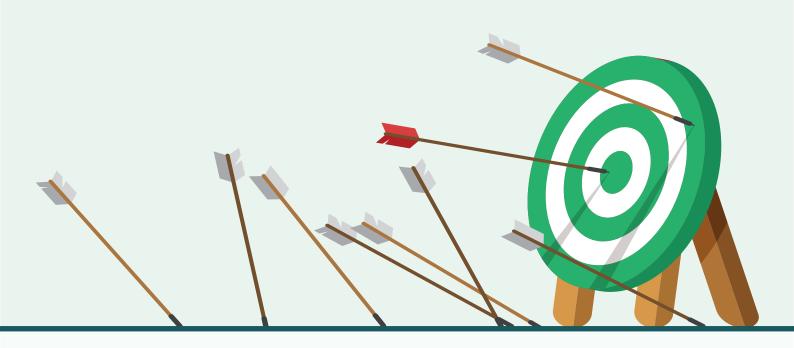

 - Mortgage providers
 - Movers and packers
 - House staging experts
 - Architecture firms
 - Real estate attorneys
 - Interior design companies
 - Landscapers



Practice Makes Perfect

- The key to mastery lies in practice. Be prepared for typical client questions Answering these professionally can help move clients along the sales journey.
- Prospective clients tend to ask similar questions so being prepared is essential for success. Typical questions include:
 - How is the real estate market at the moment?
 - I would love to sell my home, but I'm not sure what it's worth
 - Why should I work with you as my agent?
 - What are the interest rates right now?
 - Is it better to rent or buy a home right now?

- Practice your questioning technique as well. Some good questions to ask include:
 - What's brought you to the decision to buy a property?
 - Tell me, what does your dream home look like?
 - What concerns do you have about buying a property?
 - Are you working with other agents? What qualities are you looking for in the agent you work with?
 - Has anyone walked you through the entire purchase process and mortgage process should you be taking out a loan?
